Rejoice with the angels at this good news.





Everyday Bible Conversations

In the middle of our Wednesday Evening Worship service we read the appointed Scripture for the next Sunday and spend time in conversation about the questions that are stirred up within us. My intent as pastor is to listen carefully to your questions and conversation and then address them during the sermon on the following Sunday. We call this part of the Wednesday service "Everyday Bible Conversations."

As has long been the practice we begin worship each week with confession and forgiveness and close with holy communion. We recently added time for prayers for those that we know and love who are struggling with health concerns.
