Pastor's Thoughts for January

Just before the blizzard blasted into our area on Dec. 23rd, Rick Samuelson came to put up barriers across the cemetery driveway. Almost at the same time Duane Hanson was working on the metal rods sticking out of the ground at the site of the historical marker. That's when Rick saw a slow drip coming out of a water faucet along the driveway. Upon investigation the men discovered that a water valve was not completely shut off. The discovery came just ahead of the storm and subsequent bitter cold. With certainty those pipes would have frozen and there would have been extensive repairs necessary in the spring. "For just such a time as this..."

Perhaps the most famous verse in the book of Esther is spoken by Esther's uncle Mordecai in chapter 4. Esther is now a queen in the royal palace. The Jewish people are about to be massacred and Mordecai has sought her out in a desperate attempt to save her people. He says, "Who knows? Perhaps you have come to royal dignity for just such a time as this."

Who knows? Rick and Duane were in the right place at the right time to solve a problem. "For just such a time as this..."

In our baptisms each of us becomes a member of God's family; an heir of the kingdom. When we confess that Jesus sits at the right hand of God the Father we are using royal imagery. No, we don't sit at the right hand of God, but we do have a place in the royal throne room as members of God's family.

Is it possible that you have been placed in a particular position in your life "For just such a time as this...? Is it possible that God has an especially important work for you to do or an especially important word for you to speak? "for just such a time as this...'

As we entered 2020, we had no idea what was in our future. We are once again at the beginning of a new year and have little idea what lies ahead. But we can trust God to utilize our hearts, our hands, and our voices to bring about a taste of the kingdom here on earth. We can trust that we are here for just such a time as this.

Mark's Musings - A TV Christmas

For decades now, two staples of broadcast TV at Christmas time are the movies "It's a Wonderful Life" and "A Charlie Brown Christmas." Back in December of 2017, I showed clips from It's A Wonderful Life to the Wednesday evening gathering at Vasa. We talked about how, although he never mentioned Jesus by name, the character of George Bailey is an ideal Christian. Over and over George shares what he has, even to the point of despair. But in the end, his faith is rewarded. The whole movie, all two hours and 10 minutes, is a set-up for the final scene. George is toasted, "To my brother George, the richest man in town!"

We watched *It's a Wonderful Life* again this Christmas Eve. Two things stood out for me. 1) When things look the darkest, George prays. "God, show me the way." He doesn't ask for divine intervention. His prayer is internal and mirrors the actions of the earliest Christians who called their movement "The Way." 2) No effort is made to extract vengeance on those responsible for his misfortune. Mr. Potter keeps the money!

Frank Capra, the writer and director of the 1946 movie, is making two points. First, we find God, not in the heavens, but in those who have known us; and second, God is uninterested in keeping score.

On December 9, 1965 49% of the televisions in America tuned into a new Christmas program created by Bill Melendez and Lee Mendelson, and written by Charles Schulz. A Charlie Brown Christmas was not expected to be successful. It used jazz instead of popular music, it used child actors instead of adults, it had no laugh track, and it was unabashedly religious.

Damian Costello recently wrote a piece for the website U.S. Catholic which stated that *A Charlie Brown Christmas* is more than a Christmas story. It deals with the whole sweep of Christianity—in under 30 minutes. Costello says that Schulz' script is written around Isaiah 53, the famous suffering servant passage. The story begins in chaos and rebellion. "All have gone away like sheep, each following his own way." (Isa. 53:6) In the midst of this rebellion a tree appears; "a sapling" with "no stately bearing to make us look." (Isa. 53:2) The abuse directed at the tree causes Charlie Brown to voice our desperation "Isn't there anyone who knows what Christmas is all about?"

Linus then recites the story of Jesus's birth from the Gospel of Luke, which dispels the chaos. Charlie Brown leaves the auditorium with the tree, but is confronted with commercialism "our infirmities." (Isa. 53:4) He places an ornament on the tree, representing the weight of the world, but believes he is defeated. "I killed it." Then, like the apostles after Jesus' crucifixion, he flees. But resurrection follows and the force of that resurrection is love. Swaddled in Linus's blanket, the tree emerges transfigured. As the program ends the children sing in harmony. It is at this point that the message in Schulz' story is clear. Jesus is the balm that makes us right with the world.

"That's what Christmas is all about Charlie Brown."


