



Summer Sermon Series



This summer we will spend time considering two books of the Bible: Job and Second Corinthians. We'll end our summer with a four week series on the Lord's Prayer.

The Old Testament book of Job will be the focus of sermons for five weeks beginning on June 7. Job is considered one of the oldest books of the Bible. The story of Job should be read as a parable, not a historical account. Like a parable, the book of Job ends with distinct lessons for the reader.

- June 7 J Job 1:1-22
- June 14 Job 3:1-10; 4:1-9; 7:11-21
- June 21 Job 14:7-15; 19:23-27
- June 28 Job 31:35-37; 38:1-11
- July 5 Job 41:1-8; 42:1-17

Following the dive into an Old Testament book, we will spend the next five weeks in the book of 2 Corinthians. Both letters to the Corinthians were written by the apostle Paul. In them he addresses the challenges of living together in Christian community.

- July 12 2 Cor 1:1-11 – Consolation
- July 19 2 Cor 2:1-10 – Forgiveness
- July 26 2 Cor 4:1-18 – Treasure in Clay Jars
- August 2 2 Cor 5:1-21 – Walk by Faith not Sight
- August 9 2 Cor 8:1-15 – Generosity

As we wrap up our summer we will spend the last three Sundays of August and the first Sunday of September looking in depth at the Lord's Prayer as it is written in Luke 11:2-4. Meda Stamper, who created this four week series wrote, we begin "with a week for the address [Our Father] and for each of the first two petitions, then a week for the three petitions related to love for neighbor and self."

Vasa Summer Worship Plans

Worship Plans for June and July 2020

The Executive team met on Wednesday, May 27 to continue planning for Vasa's return to worship in the sanctuary. The team decided:

1. Pre-recorded worship will be posted for June 7, 14, and 21.
2. Vasa will gather for worship in the sanctuary on Sunday, June 28th, at 9:00. This will be Austin Ferguson's last Sunday with us and we want to acknowledge the musical gifts that he has shared with us.
3. Vasa will return to pre-recorded worship for July 5 and 12 so that Pastor Maureen may take some vacation time.
4. June 28th will be an opportunity to try out our social distancing plans. We want to see what works and what does not. Here's what we know so far:
 - a. Everyone is expected to wear a face mask.
 - b. We will have pews blocked off so that we maintain safe social distances. (Allowances will be made for family groups.)
 - c. We will pray and we will confess our faith.
 - d. We will hear Scripture and there will be a sermon preached.
 - e. We will share communion using prepackaged communion portions and everyone will remain in their seats.
 - f. We will not sing.
 - g. We will not have a children's message.

So much changes so quickly it isn't wise to predict what our worship plans will be on July 19th and the Sundays following.

Interim Musician:

Anne Anderson has agreed to act as Vasa's interim musician beginning on July 1st. Plans for hiring a permanent musician are still pending.

News from Good Earth Village

Gowns for Good



After hearing about a push to get more personal protective equipment into the hands of health care workers through a group called gowns4good.net, I asked Pastor if Vasa would be interested in donating the choir robes which we aren't using. Pastor took the request to the Parish

Life committee who agreed this donation would be fine, and also suggested that we donate the confirmation gowns since another plan is being discussed for confirmation robes.

After washing, drying, mending, and packaging robes, as of this writing, Vasa has sent 6 gowns to Northwest Georgia Oncology Centers in Carrollton, GA and 4 gowns to Birmingham VA Medical Center in Birmingham, AL. I tried to choose recipients in states where Covid is still hitting hard.

Seven gowns will be taken to a retirement community in the Minneapolis area which has asked for gowns. There are 183 medical places from all over the US which have asked the Gowns4good group for gowns to act as personal protective equipment. While the idea originally was to encourage high school and college seniors who had to purchase their graduation gowns to donate them to a good cause, choir robes also will fill the need. Go to the above website if you have a graduation gown at your house which needs a new home.

Dear Leaders and Congregations of the Southeastern MN Synod,

As I am sure you are well aware, guidance from the office of Governor Walz, the Minnesota Department of Health, the CDC and President Trump has evolved quickly over the past few days.

Beginning May 27, religious organizations may gather for worship services in their buildings at 25% of capacity if they maintain physical distancing protocols for the duration of their time in the building, have a *COVID-19 Preparedness Plan* in place and follow MN Department of Health and local guidelines. The newest guidance from the MN Department of Health can be found [here](#) and updated guidance from the CDC for faith based organizations is [here](#). Be sure to consult your county public health resources as well. It is important to recognize that while guidance has been updated, there are things that have not yet changed.

The number of COVID-19 cases in Minnesota continues to rise as do hospitalizations and fatalities. Transmission of the virus is still occurring and, as Governor Walz repeatedly pointed out during his press conference on May 23, we have not yet hit the peak number of infections in Minnesota. This is the backdrop for conversations about when and how we will begin to gather again for in-person worship services.

The leadership in each congregation of this synod will need to work collaboratively to discern the best way forward. The choices made in one congregation will not be the same as those made in another. Please also note that all congregations must have a *COVID-19 Preparedness Plan* in place before returning to in-person gatherings. Parking Lot Worship Services and Outdoor Worship Gatherings continue to be options for many of our congregations. Those possibilities were discussed more thoroughly in my [letter on May 21](#).

As you continue to engage in conversation remember your neighbor and the wisdom from the apostle Paul, quoted above and paraphrased here: our choices, as followers of Christ, are not simply about what we can do but about what we can do to build up the whole body. Our choices, as followers of Christ, are never just about each of us as individuals but about our neighbors too.

There are many faithful ways to continue offering worship services at this time. Remember even when we do begin to gather in-person there are those who will not, for a variety of reasons, be able to join us. Remember too, that many of our pastors and deacons have health concerns which must, along with the concerns of the wider community, be considered.

I am thankful for your wise, courageous and patient leadership as you discern how to move forward. Do so with care, consider the needs of others, be thoughtful and incremental. If another partner in the conversation would be helpful, please contact an Assistant to the Bishop or myself. Much has changed in the past months and when your congregation does gather in-person again there will be things that are not the same as they once were.

Above all, I join you in giving thanks to God who is an ever present help in a time of need.¹


